

# To write a complete weather report

## Steps to Success:

- 1) Summarise forecast in 15 words.
- 2) Include adjectives to describe weather conditions.
- 3) Close forecast with extra information .

# What makes a good weather report?

The forecaster...

- tells us where the place is
- tells us what time of day it is for
- tells us the conditions and what they are like
- is quite friendly, but very polite
- sometimes adds extra information (about events or what to wear etc) to keep it interesting

Watch the latest report.

How does the forecast start and end?

The beginning may include

- a brief summary of the weather
- the forecaster may say whether they think it is good or bad weather.

The end may include

- an outlook
- talk about big events (eg festivals, sports events)
- tell you where you can find out more (eg internet)

There may be something different, or none of these might happen!

Read your forecast and time it with the clock. try to aim for 2 minutes!

Weather report Plan:

Opening: Welcome and brief summary. (mention the day and date too)

Main forecast: Remember to include the following:

- Tonight
- 1) Place
  - 2) Time (tonight)
  - 3) Temperature
  - 4) Conditions

- Tomorrow
- 1) Place
  - 2) Time (tomorrow)
  - 3) Temperatures
  - 4) Conditions

Ending: Choose one or two of these:

- Outlook (what will happen over the next few days)
- Weather for any special events (big sports event, festival, concert)
- How to find out more information (eg: website, next forecast)
